Dear Players and Parents,

We would like to welcome you and your family to the 13th Annual "Little Mo" Internationals tournament in West Orange, New Jersey and the 2nd leg of the 2024 "Little Mo" Slam! This prestigious event will be held at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) from Saturday, August 17 - Wednesday, August 21, 2024. Approximately 200 players from 24 different countries/territories worldwide will be featured in this international tournament including Brazil, Canada, China, Colombia, Croatia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, France, Guatemala, Haiti, India, Israel, Japan, Lavia, Mexico, Mongolia, Peru, Serbia, Sweden, United Kingdom, Ukraine, Venezuela, Zambia, and 16 states across the USA! With so many talented players from around the world, we hope it will be a fantastic week filled with new friendships, great sportsmanship, and competitive tennis. In 2006, MCB created the "Little Mo" Internationals for USA players to experience different styles of play, learn about various countries and cultures, and meet others from around the world. This flagship event was first held in Texas and it has evolved over the years into three different tournaments held in Colorado, New Jersey, and Florida. Today, the Internationals attract thousands of talented girls and boys (ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12) who travel from across the United States and worldwide to compete against others born in the same year. The "Big Mo" divisions have also been added in Colorado and Florida for ages 13, 14, 15, and 16. These unique events are held at some of the most prominent and historic tennis clubs in the United States, which helps to create an unforgettable experience and enjoyable vacation for the entire family. There are also many fun tourist attractions and sights to see near our three international tournaments such as Pikes Peak, Garden of the Gods, US Open, Times Square, Statue of Liberty, Broadway Shows, Disney World, Epcot, and beautiful beaches.

This year, our host sites are the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado (June 28 - July 3), the West Orange Tennis Club in West Orange, New Jersey (August 17-21), and the Palm Beach Gardens Tennis Center in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida (December 6-11). In Colorado and Florida, yellow (regular) ball divisions will be offered for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16 in addition to a green dot option for ages 8, 9, and 10. In New Jersey, yellow (regular) ball divisions will be offered for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 in addition to a green dot option for ages 8, 9, and 10. In New Jersey, yellow (regular) ball divisions will be offered for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 in addition to a green dot option for ages 8, 9, and 10. The "Big Mo" divisions for ages 13, 14, 15, and 16 will <u>mot</u> be offered due to limited courts in New Jersey. All players will have an opportunity to participate in Singles, Doubles, and Mixed Doubles in addition to many exciting and memorable activities such as the Player Clinic, Player Parade of Nations, Group Photo, Opening Ceremony, Player Gift Exchange tradition, "Mo" Coins for prizes, Player Party, "Little Mo" Big Mo" Booth, and much more. All yellow ball results from the "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) will count towards your player's Universal Tennis Rating (UTR). All green dot results will also count towards your player's Universal Tennis Color Ball Rating (CBR). Last year, the "Little Mo" Internationals in Florida featured approximately 700 players from over 60 different countries and territories worldwide!

Have you ever dreamed of winning the tallest trophy in junior tennis? In 2013, MCB created the ultimate challenge for any player (ages 8-12) to win the "Little Mo" Slam. The Slam was created in honor of Maureen Connolly's Grand Slam win in 1953 - winning all four major championships (Australian, French, Wimbledon, and US Open) in the same calendar year. If a "Little Mo" player can win their <u>vellow ball division</u> at all three "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) in the same year, they will receive the tallest trophy in junior tennis (6 feet tall) and the title of "Little Mo" Slam Champion! The Slam continues this year with the 1st leg at the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado (June 28 - July 3). The 2nd leg will take place at the West Orange Tennis Club in West Orange, New Jersey (August 17-21). The 3rd and final leg will be held at the Palm Beach Gardens, Florida (December 6-11). There have been 11 players who have accomplished this magnificent feat in the past 11 years. *Who will win the "Little Mo" Slam this year*?

The festivities will begin on Saturday, August 17 with a complimentary tennis clinic featuring fun drills, games, and prizes for all players at the West Orange Tennis Club from 1:00-3:00pm. A special Group Photo will be taken at 3:15pm and the spectacular Opening Ceremony will begin at 4:00pm with the players parading onto the center court carrying their country flags. The national anthem will be sung. Cindy Brinker Simmons, MCB President and daughter of Maureen "Little Mo" Connolly Brinker, will be the Guest Speaker and she will give an inspirational message to the players and parents about her mother's legacy and sign her new book, *Restored: Reconnecting Life's Broken Pieces*. Matches will begin for all divisions on Sunday, August 18 and continue through Wednesday, August 21. The winner of each division will be crowned a "Little Mo" Internationals champion! On Sunday evening, a fun player party will be held for all of our families at the Dave & Buster's near the West Orange Tennis Club from 6:00-8:00pm. There will be many exciting activities for the players including virtual reality, videogames, arcade, billiards, dodgeball, and other games. We hope you will join us for this special occasion as it will be a great opportunity to meet other players from around the world.

The "Little Mo" tournaments are hosted by MCB in memory of its tennis champion namesake, Maureen "Little Mo" Connolly Brinker. Bom in San Diego, Maureen became the first woman to achieve the Grand Slam of tennis in 1953 by winning all four major championships (Australian, French, Wimbledon, and US Open) in the same year. She was well known for her powerful groundstrokes from the baseline, which earned her the famous nickname "Little Mo" - a comparison to the explosive firepower of the battleship USS *Missouri*, also known as "Big Mo". Only five players in the history of tennis have won the calendar Grand Slam, and Maureen is still the only American woman and the youngest at age 18 to have accomplished this magnificent feat. She won an amazing nine consecutive championship titles (three US, three Wimbledon, two French, one Australian - <u>undefeated in 50 matches</u>).

Unfortunately, Maureen's spectacular career would be short-lived due to a horseback riding accident in 1954. While she could no longer compete at an elite level, her legacy as a legendary tennis star would continue through the Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation (MCB). Founded in 1968 with her dear friend Nancy Jeffett, MCB's mission would be the promotion and support of junior tennis development worldwide. That same year, Maureen was inducted into the prestigious International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport, Rhode Island. Sadly, she lost her valiant battle with cancer the following year and passed away at the young age of 34. Although her tennis career only spanned three years, many premier sportswriters consider Maureen Connolly to be the finest of all female players for her achievements on and off the court. In 2019, she was honored by the United States Postal Service with her very own "Little Mo" Commemorative Forever Stamp.

Today, MCB continues to support the growth of junior tennis by organizing numerous "Little Mo" tournaments throughout the United States for talented girls and boys (ages 8-16). These events are designed to provide outstanding competition at the regional, national, and international level while also encouraging players to develop new friendships, learn good sportsmanship, and most of all, have fun. The "Little Mo" tournaments are also unique in that young players have the opportunity to gauge their ability against others born in the same year from around the world (i.e., 8's play 8's, 9's play 9's). MCB strives to empower young athletes by giving travel grants, "Mo" Coins for prizes, and also Sportsmanship and Kindness awards to deserving individuals in honor of Maureen's legacy. Additionally, the Foundation contributes financially to many notable programs including the National Junior Tennis League for inner-city youth and Invest In A Child for deaf and wheelchair tennis.

Over the years, many well-known collegiate players and famous tennis professionals have participated in the "Little Mo" tournaments including Andy Roddick, Coco Gauff, Taylor Fritz, Tommy Paul, Belinda Bencic, Madison Keys, Leylah Fernandez, Dominic Thiem, Emma Raducanu, Sebastian Korda, Christopher Eubanks, Jenson Brooksby, Brandon Nakashima, Vasek Pospisil, Borna Coric, Mackie McDonald, Denis Kudla, Ryan Harrison, Taylor Townsend, Donald Young, Steve Johnson, Sofia Kenin, CiCi Bellis, and Ana Konjuh among many others. Roddick won the "Little Mo" in 1992 (age 10) and he said, *"the 'Little Mo' was my first big win!"* Gauff won the "Little Mo" in 2012 (age 8) and she said, *"the 'Little Mo' is where the belief began."* This is all wonderful news for junior tennis and we are so proud that the "Little Mo" continues to be one of the most popular tournaments for young players around the world.

Maureen Connolly was known for her many outstanding victories, but more importantly for her exemplary sportsmanship and kindness on and off the court. To honor her legacy, the "Little Mo" tournaments offer special "Mo" Coins to players who display good sportsmanship and who are respectful and kind to others. The referee, officials, and tournament staff will have the colorful "Mo" Coins in their pockets to give to players during the event. All players will be able to trade in their coins for prizes at the "Little Mo" Booth during the tournament (<u>each coin is worth \$1</u>). The "Little Mo" Booth will be located at the host site. Sportsmanship and Kindness Awards will also be given to four deserving players selected by the officials during the tournament.

The "Little Mo" began in 1976 as a local tournament for Dallas youngsters and later grew to include players from all over Texas. In 1998, it expanded nationwide and became known as the "Road to the Little Mo Nationals", one of the premier series of junior tournaments for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12. The Road is now in its 27th year as a yearlong circuit of regional and national tournaments for players who reside in the USA and its territories. It is the only circuit of its kind for talented, high-performance girls and boys in the United States who compete against others born in the same year.

The Road begins in the spring and summer with the four "Little Mo" Regionals (North, South, East, West) held in different cities across the United States. Yellow (regular) ball divisions will be offered for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 in addition to a green dot option for ages 8, 9, and 10. The top four <u>vellow ball</u> players (semifinalists) in each age division from each regional tournament will advance to the prestigious "Little Mo" Nationals in Austin, Texas from September 27-30, 2024. These players will form a 16-size draw in each age division at the Nationals. The top 160 players who reach the Nationals are the youngest and brightest future stars in American tennis! All yellow ball results from the "Road to the Little Mo Nationals" (Regionals, Nationals) will count towards your player's Universal Tennis Rating (UTR). All green dot results will also count towards your player's Universal Tennis Color Ball Rating (CBR).

For more information, please visit our MCB website (www.mcbtennis.org) and click on the "Tournaments" tab. Registration for all regional tournaments will be on a firstcome, first-served basis up to the entry limit - we will be accepting the first 32 players in each division. If a division reaches the entry limit before the registration deadline, a WAITING LIST will be established at that time. Be sure to register early as the draws typically fill before the registration deadline (some draws are already full)! **Please note that once you have received a confirmation email from UTR/Stripe, your player's entry has been accepted into the tournament and you can make your travel arrangements.* We would also recommend signing up for our monthly newsletter to ensure that you receive the most up-to-date information throughout the year. Draws / Match Times: The draws and first-day match times for all divisions will be posted on the tournament's **USTA** homepage (link included above) by Friday evening, August 16 - not before 7:00pm Eastern Time. We will be sending out an email to all registered players when the draws/match times are posted online. When available, please click on the "Draws" tab, select your player's division in the list, and look for your player's name in the draw. Please note that the USTA platform will show all players and their individual age divisions under the general headings of: "8 & under", "10 & under", and "12 & under". This simply means that the 8's players and their draws will be found under the "8 & under" headings, the 9's and 10's players and their draws will be found under the "10 & under" headings, and the 11's and 12's players and their draws will be found under the "12 & under" headings. Unfortunately, the USTA platform is unable to have specific headers for each individual age division at this time. We would also like to let you know that while the USTA name and logo are featured at the top of the drawsheets, MCB Tennis Foundation is not affiliated with the USTA. We do follow most of the USTA guidelines, employ USTA officials, and use their software to run our "Little Mo" tournaments, but we are a separate non-profit 501(c)(3) organization.

<u>Match Location / Tournament Desk</u>: All matches for this tournament will be played at the West Orange Tennis Club (abbreviated as "WOTC" on the draws online). There will be a Tournament Desk at the host site. Please remember to check your draw carefully each day for the correct match time. Also, please check in at least 30 minutes prior to each match at the Tournament Desk while allowing some extra time for traffic and parking.

Results / Next Dav Match Times: The draws online will be updated during the tournament with results as matches are completed throughout the day. The Sunday match times will be posted by <u>Friday evening</u>, <u>August 16 - not before 7:00pm Eastern Time</u>. The Monday match times will be posted at the conclusion of play on Sunday (not before 7:00pm), the Tuesday match times will be posted at the conclusion of play on Monday (not before 7:00pm), and the Wednesday match times will be posted at the conclusion of play on Monday (not before 7:00pm), and the Wednesday match times will be posted at the conclusion of play on Tuesday (not before 7:00pm) tournament's **USTA** homepage will have the most up-to-date information about the event so please save and bookmark the link above. *Be sure to check the USTA homepage on a regular basis for important updates during the tournament (weather, draw changes, et cetera)*.

2024 "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) <u>Rules and Regulations</u>

Welcome to the 2024 "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida)! These tournaments are designed to provide outstanding competition at the international level while also encouraging players to develop new friendships, learn good sportsmanship, and most of all, have fun. The Internationals are the only tournaments of their kind for talented, high-performance girls and boys worldwide who compete against others born in the same year. <u>Please read through the following rules and regulations carefully</u>:

- <u>Eligibility</u>: The three "Little Mo" Internationals will be held in Colorado, New Jersey, and Florida. The international tournaments are open to any player worldwide (ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12). The "Big Mo" divisions have also been added in Colorado and Florida for ages 13, 14, 15, and 16. There are no special qualifications or ranking needed to register for the international tournaments any player who registers will be accepted into the draw <u>until the entry limit is reached</u>. **Please note that players <u>do not</u> need to compete in the "Little Mo" Regionals or the "Little Mo" Nationals in order to participate in the "Little Mo" Internationals*.
- <u>Entry Limits / Confirmation Email</u>: Registration for the "Little Mo" Internationals will be on a <u>first-come</u>, <u>first-served basis up to the</u> <u>entry limit we will be using several different entry limits based on the tournament (see below)</u>. If a division reaches the entry limit before the registration deadline, a WAITING LIST will be established at that time. Be sure to register early as the draws typically fill before the registration deadline! **Please note that once you have received a confirmation email from UTR/Stripe, your player's entry has been accepted into the tournament and you can make your travel arrangements*.
 - <u>Colorado</u>: Registration will be limited to the <u>first 30 players in each division</u> with 2 wildcards to be determined by MCB. All divisions will initially be limited to a 32-size draw (maximum), but it may be possible for some divisions to expand into a 64-size draw based on court capacity.
 - <u>New Jersey</u>: Registration will be limited to the <u>first 14 players in each division</u> with 2 wildcards to be determined by MCB. All divisions will initially be limited to a 16-size draw (maximum due to limited courts in New Jersey), but it may be possible for some divisions to expand into a 32-size draw based on court capacity.
 - Florida: Registration will be limited to the first 30 players in each division with 2 wildcards to be determined by MCB. All divisions will initially be limited to a 32-size draw (maximum), but it may be possible for some divisions to expand into a 64-size draw based on court capacity.
- <u>Multiple Tournaments</u>: Players may compete in any "Little Mo" Internationals regardless of where they are currently living in the United States or worldwide. Players may also compete in as many international tournaments as desired.
- Events / Guaranteed Matches: The "Little Mo" Internationals will offer <u>Singles</u>, <u>Doubles</u>, and <u>Mixed Doubles</u> events for all divisions. All players will be guaranteed at least two Singles matches during the international tournaments in addition to one Doubles match and one Mixed Doubles match (only if they are able to find a partner for each event).
- <u>Age Eligibility / Registration by Birth Year</u>: Players <u>must</u> register in the proper age division according to their birth year. This ensures that our players are competing against others who are born in the same calendar year (i.e., a player born in 2014 must play in the 10's division since they will be turning 10 this year).
 - Girls and Boys 16's ("Big Mo") born in 2008
 - o Girls and Boys 15's ("Big Mo") born in 2009
 - Girls and Boys 14's ("Big Mo") born in 2010
 - Girls and Boys 13's ("Big Mo") born in 2011
 - o Girls and Boys 12's born in 2012
 - Girls and Boys 11's born in 2013
 - Girls and Boys 10's born in 2014
 - Girls and Boys 9's born in 2015
 - Girls and Boys 8's born in 2016 (Only players who are born in 2016 will be allowed to play in the 8's divisions. Players born in 2017 or 2018 will <u>not</u> be eligible.)
- Divisions: The "Little Mo" Internationals will be offering several different divisions based on the tournament:
 - <u>Colorado and Florida</u>: Yellow (regular) ball divisions will be offered for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16 in addition to a green dot option for ages 8, 9, and 10. <u>Players must register for only one division</u>. This means that players competing in the 8's, 9's, and 10's divisions must choose to play with either the yellow (regular) ball <u>or</u> the green dot ball for their age group. Players in the 11's and 12's divisions must play with the yellow (regular) ball. All divisions will be played on a full 78' tennis court with either the yellow (regular) ball.
 - <u>New Jersey</u>: Yellow (regular) ball divisions will be offered for girls and boys ages 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 in addition to a green dot option for ages 8, 9, and 10. The "Big Mo" divisions for ages 13, 14, 15, and 16 will <u>not</u> be offered due to limited courts in New Jersey. <u>Players must register for only one division</u>. This means that players competing in the 8's, 9's, and 10's divisions must choose

to play with either the yellow (regular) ball <u>or</u> the green dot ball for their age group. Players in the 11's and 12's divisions must play with the yellow (regular) ball. All divisions will be played on a full 78' tennis court with either the yellow (regular) ball or the green dot ball.

- **Draw Formats**: All divisions will use the same draw formats regardless of age or ball type, but we will be using several different draw formats based on the event type and draw size:
 - o <u>Singles</u>:
 - <u>64-size draw, 32-size draw, 16-size draw or 8-size draw</u>: A First Match Losers Consolation format with a 3rd/4th Place playoff will be used. This means that any player who loses in the First Round (Main Draw) will move into the Consolation bracket. Any player who has a bye in the First Round (Main Draw) and loses in the Second Round (Main Draw) will also move into the Consolation bracket. The losers of the Semifinal Round (Main Draw) will move into a 3rd/4th Place playoff.
 <u>5 or less players</u>: A Round Robin format will be used.
 - **Doubles and Mixed Doubles**: A **Single Elimination format** will be used for all draw sizes. This means that any team who loses in any round will **not** advance in the draw. A Consolation bracket is not possible as there is only a Main Draw in this format.
- <u>Scoring Formats</u>: All divisions will use the same scoring formats regardless of age, ball type or draw format, but we will be using several different scoring formats based on the event type:
 - Singles: All Singles matches (Main Draw and Consolation) will consist of two tiebreak sets (first to 6 games). At 6 games all, a 7point set tiebreak (first to 7, win by 2) will be played. If players split sets, a 10-point match tiebreak (first to 10, win by 2) will be played in lieu of a third set. Regular scoring (<u>with ad</u>) will be used for all Main Draw matches and a 5-minute warm-up will be given before each match. No-ad scoring will be used for all Consolation matches in addition to the 3rd/4th Place playoff. A 2-minute rest period will be given between the first and second sets, and a 3-minute rest period will be given between the second set and match tiebreak. <u>No coaching is allowed at any time</u>. **Shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain*.
 - Doubles and Mixed Doubles: All Doubles and Mixed Doubles matches will consist of an 8-game pro set (first to 8 games). At 8 games all, a 7-point match tiebreak (first to 7, win by 2) will be played. Regular scoring (with ad) will be used for all matches and a 5-minute warm-up will be given before each match. No coaching is allowed at any time. *Shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain.
- <u>Bathroom Break Courtesy Point</u>: If a player needs to go to the bathroom, they need to get permission from an official. *To minimize loss of momentum <u>during the set</u> caused by a bathroom break, the player(s) taking the break will give a courtesy point to their opponent(s). This is <u>not</u> a penalty point. A courtesy point will <u>not</u> be given for a bathroom break taken at the end of a set. <u>This rule is unique to the</u> <u>"Little Mo" tournaments.</u>*
- <u>Doubles / Mixed Doubles Information</u>: The "Little Mo" Internationals entry fee includes <u>Singles</u>, <u>Doubles</u>, and <u>Mixed Doubles</u> so there are no additional fees to participate in these events. All registrations for Doubles and Mixed Doubles will be taken on-site during the tournament (<u>no registrations will be taken in advance or by email</u>). If a player already has a partner selected for Doubles and/or Mixed Doubles, there will be a desk on-site at the host site on the first day where they will be able to sign up together with their partner(s). If a player would like to try and find a partner before the tournament, we will be posting the official Player List in the weeks leading up to the tournament (<u>not before the registration deadline</u>) and players will be able to contact each other through the UTR system at that time. If a player <u>does not</u> have a partner selected before the tournament and they would still like to play in Doubles and/or Mixed Doubles, there will be a "Looking for Partner" sign-up sheet posted at the host site on the first day. Players will be able to place their name and cell phone on this sheet in order to connect with possible partners. Eligibility for Doubles and Mixed Doubles is as follows:
 - **Doubles**: Players must compete in the same exact age division and ball type as they are registered in for Singles. For example, a player registered in the Boys 10 (yellow ball) division for Singles must play in the Boys 10 (yellow ball) division for Doubles.
 - Mixed Doubles: Players may compete with someone younger or older in a different age division, but they must play in the division of the older player. Players may also compete in a different ball type, but a yellow ball player cannot "play down" into a green dot division. For example, a Boys 9 (green dot) player who decides to play Mixed Doubles with a Girls 10 (yellow ball) player must play in the Mixed 10 (yellow ball) division since that is the older division between the two players.
 - <u>Please note that there is no guarantee a player will be able to compete in Doubles and/or Mixed Doubles unless they have a partner for each event players are ultimately responsible for finding their own partners.</u>
- <u>Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) / Color Ball Rating (CBR)</u>: All yellow ball results from the "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) will count towards your player's Universal Tennis Rating (UTR). All green dot results will also count towards your player's Universal Tennis Color Ball Rating (CBR).

<u>Code of Conduct for</u> "Little Mo" Tournaments

The "Little Mo" tournaments are organized by the Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation (MCB). These events are named in memory of Maureen "Little Mo" Connolly Brinker, who was known for her outstanding sportsmanship on and off the court. Your participation in the "Little Mo" tournament should reflect this gold standard of behavior. In registering for any "Little Mo" tournament, we expect all players, parents, coaches, spectators, and other participants to adhere to its Code of Conduct. That includes exhibiting the following behavior:

- 1. You must be considerate and respectful of the rights of all participants and spectators regardless of their age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, sexual orientation, or religious beliefs.
- 2. You must play within the rules of tennis and respect the officials and their decisions. There shall be no arguments, no displays of aggressiveness, no cursing or profane behavior, no volatile anger, or similar behavior against the referees, other players, opponents, or members of the tournament committee.
- **3.** You must play fairly. Cheating of any kind will <u>not</u> be tolerated, including but not limited to, intentionally and willfully calling the lines incorrectly, calling the score incorrectly, and intentionally delaying the game.
- 4. You will <u>not</u> receive or offer any form of coaching from the sidelines during match play.
- 5. You must look presentable on court and pick up after yourself at all times.
- 6. You are expected to be positive, respectful, and supportive of other players.
- 7. MCB has a zero-tolerance policy for any person videotaping or capturing the image of opposing players, their family members/guests, staff, officials, volunteers, and anyone related to the event with the intent of posting derogatory, offensive, or disparaging comments about them online or on any social media platform. This includes, but is not limited to, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube, LinkedIn, and TikTok. MCB will <u>not</u> permit this kind of demeaning behavior related to any of its "Little Mo" tournaments. Consequences of this action may include the immediate default of a player from the tournament and/or the dismissal of the offending parent, coach, spectator, or participant from the tournament, in addition to other consequences as determined by MCB.
- 8. Most "Little Mo" tournaments use multiple playing sites due to the large number of players involved in the event. If you have more than one child entered in a tournament, MCB is <u>not</u> able to guarantee they will be playing at the same site. Therefore, it is highly recommended to bring an additional guardian for each child you bring to a tournament. <u>For safety reasons, a player should not be left alone without a guardian at any time</u>.

Parents / Coaches / Spectators / Other Participants:

- No coaching, hand signals, or any communication with the player when on court. Only English can be spoken when the player is on court.
- No clapping when the opponent double faults or makes an unforced error.
- No loud, excessive or constant cheering/clapping that is disruptive or distracting to players while on court. This includes cheering that distracts other players on adjacent courts and cheering across another court during a match.
- No interference with the match or arguing with, yelling at, or threatening the officials or Tournament Director. Their decisions are final.
- No yelling at or threatening anyone especially players.
- Emotional, physical, or sexual misconduct will **<u>not</u>** be tolerated at "Little Mo" tournaments. This includes but is not limited to child abuse, endangerment, and neglect.

Players:

- No coaching, hand signals, or any communication is allowed during your match. Only English can be spoken when the player is on court.
- No cursing or yelling on court. This includes yelling "come on" or other distracting outbursts that can be heard on other courts.
- No hitting the ball to the back of the fence or the net in anger.
- No hitting the ball away from the player when it is their serve.
- The server must announce the score loudly in English before every point. All players must know how to keep score and announce it correctly.
- If a player needs to go to the bathroom, they must ask an official for permission. We encourage players to only go to the bathroom at a set break to minimize loss of momentum during the set. Any player taking a bathroom break that is **not** at the end of a set must give a courtesy point to their opponent. Players will be accompanied to and from the bathroom by an official when possible.
- Play fair! No cheating of any kind will be tolerated. Please make correct line calls if in doubt about a call, it is IN. No delay of game.

We would like everyone to have a wonderful and memorable experience at the "Little Mo" tournaments. Let the memory of your match be a good one for both you and your opponent, whether you win or lose.

Consequences of Behavior:

During a Match:

The officials will be watching the matches closely and if a player breaches the Code of Conduct during the match, the player will be given:

- 1. First offense: A warning.
- 2. Second offense: A point penalty.
- 3. Third offense: A game penalty.

If the behavior continues after the game penalty, additional game penalties will continue to be given until the match is over. The behavior of parents, coaches, spectators, and other participants can also cause their player to receive the above penalties, and may also result in consequences to the offending individual, including removal. However, the tournament committee has the discretion to issue an immediate default to the player in cases where the conduct rises to a level at which an official determines that, in the interest of fairness or the health and safety of participants, the match cannot proceed.

In addition to the above, an official may, in his or her discretion, take the following actions, among others, in the event of a breach of the Code of Conduct by a player, parent, coach, spectator, or other participant: issue a warning OR begin the ejection and/or default process.

If a parent/guardian is ejected from a match and/or the premises, their player will forfeit any match in progress and will be asked to leave with their parent/guardian unless (1) another parent/guardian is available to stay with the player; or (2) the parent/guardian's misconduct was directed at the player and MCB believes the parent/guardian poses an immediate threat to the player, in which case the Tournament Director and MCB will work with the player and law enforcement, if needed, to determine appropriate steps.

Any ruling made by an official and/or the tournament committee during a match is final.

Additional Consequences:

Regardless of whether an official issues a penalty during a match, MCB may take the following additional actions, in its discretion and without limitation, in response to a breach of this Code of Conduct: refuse the entry of any player wanting to register for any "Little Mo" tournament; not invite a player to the next round of the "Road to the Little Mo Nationals" circuit; prohibit a player or other individual from attending "Little Mo" events for any period of time, up to a lifetime ban; impose conditions on an individual's attendance at "Little Mo" events; revoke any trophies or travel grants from any player. **Repeated violations at the same match or multiple matches over time may also result in additional penalties**.

Law Enforcement:

MCB reserves the right to call or report behavior to law enforcement when required and when MCB otherwise deems necessary or appropriate according to USTA Safe Play guidelines.

Reporting:

If you are a player, parent, coach, spectator, or other participant and you reasonably believe that an individual has breached this Code of Conduct, or that anyone at a "Little Mo" tournament (including officials and event staff) has committed emotional, physical, or sexual misconduct (including but not limited to child abuse), you may make a report to MCB at: <u>carol@mcbtennis.org</u>.





MCB Tournament Waiver

Covenant Not to Sue; Release and Waiver: In consideration of the Maureen "Little Mo" Connolly Brinker Tennis, ("MCB") accepting the registration or application and membership of Participant and/or Participant's registration or application in any (i) MCB sanctioned tournament or event, or (ii) any other event for which applications are accepted through links on any website associated or partnered with MCB (collectively, a "Tournament" or "Tournaments") Participant (or if Participant is a minor, Participant's Parent and/or Guardian) covenant and promise not to sue or bring any claim, demand or other action against MCB and its affiliates, or any of their members, directors, officers, employees, attorneys, volunteers, sponsors, committees, representatives, independent contractors or agents, including but not limited to any organization or individual conducting any tournament or event of any kind and any committees, organizations, officials, or individuals associated therewith and their respective successors or assigns (collectively, the "MCB Parties" or individually a "MCB Party"), and discharge, release and waive each of them from all liability in connection with all allegations, demands, or other claims for any of (1) personal injury or illness (including death) and/or (2) damage to, or loss or theft of property (including, without limitation, personal items, car, and money), and/or (3) any other losses or damages (whether monetary or otherwise) that may be alleged or claimed against any MCB Party arising, directly or indirectly, or to any extent whatsoever, from Participant's (1) membership in MCB; (2) presence at or participation in any Tournament (or travel to and from thereto); (3) receipt of medical care or treatment for any physical or mental condition; (4) use of services, premises, and equipment by whomever provided; and (5) involvement in accidents; travel; exposure to inclement weather; and/or any other circumstance or cause of a similar nature, but excluding MCB's gross negligence, willful misconduct or criminal behavior. Participant and if applicable, Participant's Parent or Guardian acknowledge and agree that the provisions hereof shall be binding upon Participant's heirs, family, next of kin, personal representative, successors and assigns.

Indemnification: Participant and Parent/Guardian also agree to indemnify and hold harmless each of the MCB Parties from any and all actual or threatened claims, detriments, rights, remediation, counterclaims, liens, controversies, obligations, agreements, suits, causes of action, actions, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, assessments, judgments, fines, penalties, threats, sums of money, accounts, costs, expenses, known or unknown, direct or indirect, at law or in equity or in settlement or in any other proceeding and whether or not suit was filed thereon (collectively, the "Claims", individually a "Claim") directly or indirectly, to any extent whatsoever, caused by Participant and/or his/her Parent/Guardian and to reimburse upon demand the MCB Parties for any and all expenses or other damages incurred for Claims brought against any of the MCB Parties as a result of Participant's and/or his/her Parent's/Guardian's membership in MCB; presence at or participating in any Tournament; receipt of medical care or treatment for any physical or mental condition; use of services, premises, and equipment by whomever provided; as well as Participant's and/or his/her Parent's/Guardian's negligence, willful misconduct, or criminal behavior; involvement in accidents; travel; exposure to inclement weather; and/or any other circumstance or cause of a similar nature, but excluding MCB's willful misconduct or criminal behavior. THE INDEMNITY CONTAINED IN THIS PARAGRAPH WILL APPLY EVEN IF AN INJURY IS CAUSED IN WHOLE OR IN PART BY THE ORDINARY NEGLIGENCE OR STRICT LIABILITY OF ANY MCB PARTY BUT WILL NOT APPLY TO THE EXTENT A CLAIM IS CAUSED BY THE GROSS NEGLIGENCE, WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OR CRIMINAL BEHAVIOR OF ANY MCB PARTY. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian agree to pay all costs and attorneys' fees and expenses incurred by any of the MCB Parties with respect to any matter contained in this Consent, Release, Waiver and Indemnification including, without limitation, any costs and expenses or other damages incurred by or in connection with investigating and/or defending a Claim, proceeding or otherwise.

Authorization of Photography, Film, Audio, and Text: Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian hereby irrevocably grant to MCB, its successors and assigns, its agents and those whom it commissions or permits to be at the Tournament, the absolute, unrestricted and unlimited license, right, permission and consent to collect, use and reuse, disseminate, copyright, print, reproduce, publish and republish, for any and all trade purposes or commercial or other advertising or public purposes, and in any and all advertising, publicity, display, publication or media (collectively, a "Publication"), Participant's name, biographical materials, signature and likeness, and any portraits, pictures, photographic prints or other representations of Participant, or in which Participant may appear, or any reproductions or sketches thereof or parts thereof, photographic or otherwise (collectively, "Participant's Name and Likeness") with such additions, deletions, alterations or changes therein as MCB in its discretion may make, either separately or together with Participant's name or a fictitious name, or the name of another person, with or without any statements or testimonials made by Participant, or authorized by Participant which MCB in its discretion, prepare for use in connection therewith. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian warrant that they have not limited or restricted the use of Participant's name or photograph to the use of any organization or person. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian understand that in proceeding with the actions stated above, MCB will do so in full reliance on the foregoing permission. Further, Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian acknowledge that third parties not affiliated with MCB may also publish Participant's Name and Likeness and Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian also consent thereto. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian hereby consent, release, waive and discharge MCB Parties from any and all Claims arising out of or in connection with the use of any of the foregoing, including any claims for defamation, invasion of privacy, violation of any right of publicity or violation of any statutory right.

<u>Assumption of Risks</u>: Tennis, by its very nature, carries with it certain dangers and risks that cannot be eliminated regardless of the great care taken to prevent or minimize harm. Tennis is an activity which involves strenuous exertions of strength using various muscle groups, quick movements involving speed and change of direction, and may involve contact with equipment or fixed objections. The risks associated with tennis range from (1) minor injuries such as cuts, bruises, muscle strains and sprains, to (2) major injuries such as broken or fractured bones or concussions, to (3) catastrophic injuries, such as heart attacks or fractured skull or those that cause disfigurement, loss of mental capacity, loss of sight, speech or hearing, paralysis, or death. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian hereby expressly agree that they understand the nature of tennis and appreciate the types of injuries and risks that exist, and Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian knowingly assume all related risks.

<u>Medical Release</u>: Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian hereby consent to the rendering of emergency first aid and other medical procedures which at the time of injury or illness seems reasonably advisable. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian further understand that Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian will be responsible for payment of any such medical procedures.

<u>Severability and Venue</u>: Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian further expressly agree that this Consent, Release, Waiver, and Indemnification is intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the State of Texas and that if any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the remaining portion of the waiver will continue in full legal force and effect.

Acknowledgment of Understanding: Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian have read this waiver and fully understand its terms. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian understand that Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian are giving up rights, including the right to compensation for injury resulting from negligence of MCB. Participant and his/her Parent/Guardian acknowledge that they are agreeing to this agreement freely and voluntarily and intend it to be a complete and unconditional consent, release, and waiver of all liability to the greatest extent allowed by law. In agreeing to this waiver as Parent/Guardian, you acknowledge that you are authorized to and you are consenting to Participant's participation in MCB and MCB Tournaments held both domestically or internationally and represent to MCB that you understand all risks are assumed by Participant and yourself and all related Claims are expressly waived in advance, other than claims not expressly or implied covered herein. Your electronic signature also verifies that you agree to the consequences of behavior determined by MCB covered herein.



Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Injury, Infection, and Illness

The Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation (MCB) places a high priority on the health, safety, and concerns of its players, families, clubs, academies, and staff at the "Little Mo" tournaments. We will keep our players and parents informed of any important information and policies on the tournament's homepage or by email. We also strongly encourage anyone who is not feeling well to get proper testing, and for anyone with a positive test for a contagious infection or illness to <u>not</u> attend the tournament. We appreciate your cooperation and expect you to follow this protocol so that we can help ensure the health and safety of all players and families attending the "Little Mo" tournaments.

PLEASE KNOW THAT THERE ARE CERTAIN RISKS INVOLVED WITH ATTENDING ANY EVENT AND YOUR PARTICIPATION IN THE "LITTLE MO" TOURNAMENT IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.

With full knowledge and understanding, you are voluntarily attending the "Little Mo" tournament and that due to your mere presence at the event and any tournament site, you may experience an injury, infection, or illness and that such condition may result in temporary or permanent damage, other health conditions, disfigurement, disability, and death. You voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks and accept sole responsibility for any injury, infection, or illness to your minor children or yourself (including, but not limited to, disability, damage, loss, liability, or expense of any kind), that you or your minor children may experience or incur in connection with your presence at the "Little Mo" tournament ("Claims").

On your behalf, and on behalf of your minor children, you hereby release, covenant not to sue, discharge, and hold harmless the Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation, any tournament site, its officers, employees, agents, and representatives, of and from the Claims, including all liabilities, claims, actions, damages, costs, or expenses of any kind arising out of or relating thereto.

You understand and agree that this release includes any Claims based on the actions, omissions, or negligence of the Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation, any tournament site, its officers, employees, agents, and representatives, whether an injury, infection, or illness occurs before, during, or after being present at any "Little Mo" tournament.

Parking - West Orange Tennis Club: Complimentary self-parking will be available in the parking lot at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site), but we are asking our families to not park in any of the "reserved" spots as these are reserved for the WOTC staff. Please note that players can be dropped off at the front of the clubhouse while you find parking nearby. Also, please be mindful of any handicapped parking spots and make sure to read all of the posted parking signs/regulations very carefully or your car may be towed!

<u>No Alternate Sites / Transportation Recommendations:</u> All matches for this tournament will be played at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site). While we will not be using any alternate sites, we do recommend renting a car if you do not already have transportation. A ride-sharing service such as Uber or Lyft might also be an option based on availability in the area.

(VERY IMPORTANT) Water / Ice / Sunscreen / Shade: It may be hot this week so please remember to hydrate adequately before and during the tournament. Water and ice will be available at the host site, but we encourage our players and their families to bring their own water and ice for their coolers - please <u>do not</u> fill up your coolers from the ice machine. It is best to bring your own water bottles and cups too if needed. We also recommend bringing any sunscreen, umbrellas, sunglasses, and canopy/folding chairs needed as there may be limited shade at the host site.

Host Hotel Information: Our host hotel for the New Jersey international tournament is the Cambria Hotel West Orange (12 Rooney Circle, West Orange, NJ 07052). Most of our players and their families will be staying at the Cambria Hotel during the tournament and it will be a great place to meet some new tennis friends. The hotel is located about 8 minutes away from the West Orange Tennis Club (host site). Although our discounted room rate at the Cambria Hotel expired on August 4, there might still be some rooms available this week due to last-minute cancellations - please contact the Cambria Hotel directly at: (862) 930- 1160 for any questions about their current rates and availability. Our courtesy room block featured \$139 Double Queen rooms (before taxes). This rate included complimentary breakfast, WiFi, and self-parking

Entry Fee: \$280 per player which includes <u>Singles, Doubles, and Mixed Doubles</u> (nonrefundable after registration deadline - Friday, July 26). Please note that Universal Tennis adds an additional \$12 fee on top of our entry fee if you have not upgraded to a UTR Power subscription - this additional fee is set by UTR. The entry fee helps to cover the cost of the courts, balls, officials, t-shirts, trophies, player party, online registration fees, and other tournament expenses. A portion of the entry fee also comes back to the Foundation to help further the development of junior tennis worldwide and it is tax-deductible.

<u>Withdrawal and Refund Policy</u>: If you are unable to join us for the New Jersey international tournament, please send an email as soon as possible to: <u>tiffany@mcbtennis.org</u> to be withdrawn from the event. A player's entry fee was fully refundable up until the extended registration deadline posted on the tournament's UTR homepage – Friday, July 26 at 11:30pm (Central Time). <u>At this time, any withdrawal requests will</u> not be eligible for a refund or credit to a future tournament.

<u>Player's Birth Certificate / Passport (VERY IMPORTANT - MANDATORY)</u>: All players who participate in the "Little Mo" Internationals must present a copy of their birth certificate or passport at Player Check-in to be included in the tournament. Player Check-in will be taking place at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) on Saturday, August 17 from 10:00am - 2:00pm (anytime). Information must be able to be read in English and clearly show a player's full name and birthday (please make sure that the copy you bring is not blurry). Due to our privacy policy, we will **not** be accepting any birth certificates or passports in advance or by email. SPECIAL DRESS CODE ON SATURDAY AND TENNIS ATTIRE DURING THE TOURNAMENT (VERY IMPORTANT): There will be a special dress code required on the first day of the "Little Mo" Internationals. On Saturday, August 17 (only), our players will need to <u>wear</u> <u>all-white clothing</u> for all of the special activities scheduled for that day (colored shoes are OK). Clothing that must adhere to the "all-white" dress code includes shirts, shorts, skirts, tennis dresses, warm-ups, jackets, and sweaters (a 5-10% colored trim on clothing is allowed, but no large logos). Players can also wear the white "Little Mo" tournament t-shirt they will receive at Player Check-in on Saturday. During the tournament, we ask our players to please wear nice tennis attire for their practice and matches - colored clothing/shoes are acceptable and there are no logo restrictions. The "all-white" dress code is **not** required at any time from Sunday, August 18 - Wednesday, August 21. If you have any questions about the special dress code on Saturday, tennis attire during the tournament, or a particular item of clothing, please send an email and picture to: carol@mcbtennis.org.

<u>Plaver Parade of Nations - Country Flag (OPTIONAL)</u>: It is a special tradition that all players at the "Little Mo" Internationals participate in an Olympic-style Player Parade of Nations leading into the Opening Ceremony. This will be a very memorable occasion and players will have a unique opportunity to represent their home country. One large country flag will be provided by the tournament for each country group. If your player would like to carry their own country flag in the parade on Saturday, August 17, please be sure to bring one from your home country (no bigger than 2 feet by 3 feet). It is not required to bring a country flag.

Player Gift Exchange (VERY IMPORTANT): It is a special tradition that all players at the "Little Mo" Internationals exchange a small gift with their first-round opponent in Singles. The gift should be \$15 or less (wrapped or in a gift bag) and represent your home city/state/country since your opponent will most likely be from a different area. The gifts are exchanged as the players walk to the court for their first match. This is a fun way to meet a new friend on the first day and it will be a special memory for years to come. *If you have a bye in the First Round (Main Draw), please look at the draws posted at the host site to find out with whom you will exchange gifts as you will be paired with another player who has a bye. If you have any questions about the Player Gift Exchange, please visit the Tournament Desk during the tournament.*

Events / Guaranteed Matches: The "Little Mo" Internationals will offer <u>Singles</u>, <u>Doubles</u>, and <u>Mixed Doubles</u> events for all divisions. All players will be guaranteed at least two Singles matches during the international tournaments in addition to one Doubles match and one Mixed Doubles match (only if they are able to find a partner for each event).

Draw Formats: All divisions will use the same draw formats regardless of age or ball type, but we will be using several different draw formats based on the event type and draw size:

- <u>Singles</u>:
 - <u>32-size draw, 16-size draw or 8-size draw</u>: A First Match Losers Consolation format with a 3rd/4th Place playoff will be used. This means that any player who loses in the First Round (Main Draw) will move into the Consolation bracket. Any player who has a bye in the First Round (Main Draw) and loses in the Second Round (Main Draw) will also move into the Consolation bracket. The losers of the Semifinal Round (Main Draw) will move into a 3rd/4th Place playoff.
 - <u>5 or less players</u>: A Round Robin format will be used.
- <u>Doubles and Mixed Doubles</u>: A Single Elimination format will be used for all draw sizes. This means that any team who loses in any round will <u>not</u> advance in the draw. A Consolation bracket is not possible as there is only a Main Draw in this format.

Scoring Formats: All divisions will use the same scoring formats regardless of age, ball type or draw format, but we will be using several different scoring formats based on the event type:

• Singles: All Singles matches (Main Draw and Consolation) will consist of two tiebreak sets (first to 6 games). At 6 games all, a 7-point set tiebreak (first to 7, win by 2) will be played. If players split sets, a 10-point match tiebreak (first to 10, win by 2) will be played in lieu of a third set. Regular scoring (with ad) will be used for all Main Draw matches and a 5-minute warm-up will be given before each match. No-ad scoring will be used for all Consolation matches in addition to the 3rd/4th Place playoff. A 2-minute rest period will be given between the first and second sets, and a 3-minute rest period will be given between the second set and match tiebreak. No coaching is allowed at any time. *Shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain.

• <u>Doubles and Mixed Doubles</u>: All Doubles and Mixed Doubles matches will consist of an 8-game pro set (first to 8 games). At 8 games all, a 7-point match tiebreak (first to 7, win by 2) will be played. Regular scoring (<u>with ad</u>) will be used for all matches and a 5-minute warm-up will be given before each match. <u>No coaching is allowed at any time</u>. *Shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain.

Bathroom Break Courtesy Point: If a player needs to go to the bathroom, they need to get permission from an official. To minimize loss of momentum <u>during the set</u> caused by a bathroom break, the player(s) taking the break will give a courtesy point to their opponent(s). This is <u>not</u> a penalty point. A courtesy point will <u>not</u> be given for a bathroom break taken at the end of a set. <u>This rule is unique to the "Little Mo"</u> tournaments.

Seeding: The order of seeding will be based on verified UTR ratings, which include "Little Mo" and other tournament results. The UTR ratings used to calculate the seedings were downloaded at the close of registration (about 1-3 weeks before the tournament start date).

Doubles / Mixed Doubles Information: The "Little Mo" Internationals entry fee includes <u>Singles</u>, <u>Doubles</u>, and <u>Mixed Doubles</u> so there are no additional fees to participate in these events. All registrations for Doubles and Mixed Doubles will be taken on-site during the tournament (<u>no</u> registrations will be taken in advance or by email). If a player already has a partner selected for Doubles and/or Mixed Doubles, there will be a desk on-site at the U.S. Air Force Academy (host site) on Friday, June 28 where they will be able to sign up together with their partner(s). If a player would like to try and find a partner before the tournament, the official Player List is available as a document online (<u>https://mcbtennis.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/08/NJ24.pdf</u>) and players are able to contact each other through the UTR system. Please note

Please note that players are <u>NOT</u> able to send each other messages through the USTA system at this time. If a player <u>does not</u> have a partner selected before the tournament and they would still like to play in Doubles and/or Mixed Doubles, there will be a "Looking for Partner" sign-up sheet posted at the West Orange Tennis Club on Saturday, August 17. Players will be able to place their name and cell phone on this sheet in order to connect with possible partners. Eligibility for Doubles and Mixed Doubles is as follows:

- <u>Doubles</u>: Players must compete in the same exact age division and ball type as they are registered in for Singles. For example, a player registered in the Boys 10 (yellow ball) division for Singles must play in the Boys 10 (yellow ball) division for Doubles.
- <u>Mixed Doubles</u>: Players may compete with someone younger or older in a different age division, but they must play in the division of the older player. Players may also compete in a different ball type, but a yellow ball player cannot "play down" into a green dot division. For example, a Boys 9 (green dot) player who decides to play Mixed Doubles with a Girls 10 (yellow ball) player must play in the Mixed 10 (yellow ball) division since that is the older division between the two players.
- <u>Please note that there is no guarantee a player will be able to compete in Doubles and/or Mixed Doubles unless they have a partner</u> for each event - players are ultimately responsible for finding their own partners.

How to Message Other Players through the UTR System: The tournament cannot give out any player's personal contact information due to our privacy policy, but we have included specific instructions below on how to message other players through the UTR system:

- 1. Go to: <u>https://app.utrsports.net/home</u> and sign into your player's UTR account.
- 2. Once you have signed into your player's UTR account, you can enter the name of the player you are trying to contact in the "Search" box at the top of the screen. The player's name should automatically pop up as an option once you finish typing their name in the box. Once it appears, click on the player's name.
- 3. On the next page, click on the "Message" bubble icon that is located in the top right corner of the screen next to the player's UTR rating. You will then be able to send a message to that player.
- 4. If you receive a message from another player, UTR will automatically send a notification to the email address associated with your player's UTR account. This notification will include a link to "View Messages" in your player's UTR Inbox. If someone attempts to contact you, please be respectful and try to respond to them in a timely manner.

Universal Tennis Rating (UTR) / Color Ball Rating (CBR): All yellow ball results from the "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) will count towards your player's Universal Tennis Rating (UTR). All green dot results will also count towards your player's Universal Tennis Color Ball Rating (CBR).

Friday Practice Courts - West Orange Tennis Club: The West Orange Tennis Club (host site) is offering our players and their families an opportunity use a practice court on Friday, August 16 (not before 4:00pm) on a first-come, first-served basis (no reservations will be taken). Players will have priority over coaches/parents and we ask everyone to please share courts with other players if they are waiting (4 players per court).

Saturday Practice Courts - West Orange Tennis Club: On Saturday, practice courts will be available at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) from approximately 8:00am-12:30pm on a first-come, first-served basis (no reservations will be taken). Players will have priority over coaches/parents and we ask everyone to please share courts with other players if they are waiting (4 players per court). There will also be some practice courts available on-site after the Opening Ceremony from approximately 5:30-8:00pm on a first-come, first-served basis (no reservations will be taken).

Warm-up Courts: During the tournament, "warm-up courts" will be available at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) from approximately 7:00-8:00am each morning on a first-come, first-served basis (no reservations will be taken). Again, players will have priority over coaches/parents and we ask everyone to please share courts with other players if they are waiting (4 players per court). There will not be any "warm-up courts" available on-site after matches begin in the morning so please make other arrangements if you are needing a court during the day - there are several other clubs, facilities, and parks nearby. There will also be 4 "warm-up courts" all day at Stagg Field Tennis Courts next to West Orange Tennis Club on a first-come, first-served basis (no reservations will be taken). Additionally, the Orange Lawn Tennis Club has offered practice/warm-up courts all day based on availability (members have priority). To inquire about court availability and make a reservation during the day during the tournament, please call the Orange Lawn Tennis Club directly: (973) 726-0928. *Be sure to mention you are participating in the "Little Mo" tournament this week!*

Weather Updates / Rain Plan: We are looking forward to sunny skies and completing the New Jersey international tournament this week. If there are any important changes to the schedule due to inclement weather, we will be posting the latest updates and information on the tournament's USTA homepage: www.littlemonewjersey.com. We have reserved the indoor courts at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) and shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain. We will not be extending the tournament past Wednesday, August 21.

Player Party: A fun player party will be held for all of our families at the Dave & Buster's (Wayne) near the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) on Sunday evening, August 18 from 6:00-8:00pm. There will be many exciting activities for the players including virtual reality, videogames, arcade, billiards, dodgeball, and other games. We hope you will join us for this special occasion as it will be a great opportunity to meet other players from around the world - be sure to get their contact information so you can stay in touch after the event! Some of the games and activities are "complimentary" for all "Little Mo" players. Any "Little Mo" player who wins their <u>yellow ball division</u> (Singles only) at the "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) will receive a special travel grant during the tournament - *more details to be announced at the tournament!* These travel grants are sponsored by the **Tennis Competitors of Dallas** (TCD) in Dallas, Texas and we are so thankful for their support of junior tennis!

"Mo" Coins: Maureen Connolly was known for her many outstanding victories, but more importantly for her exemplary sportsmanship and kindness on and off the court. To honor her legacy, the "Little Mo" tournaments offer special "Mo" Coins to players who display good sportsmanship and who are respectful and kind to others. The referee, officials, and tournament staff will have the colorful "Mo" Coins in their pockets to give to players during the event. All players will be able to trade in their coins for prizes at the "Little Mo" Booth during the tournament (each coin is worth \$1). The "Little Mo" Booth will be located at the host site.

No Alcohol: During the tournament, we <u>do not</u> condone the use of alcohol at any time due to liability reasons. <u>Alcohol is also STRICTLY</u> <u>PROHIBITED from being brought into the host site</u>. Thank you so much for helping us ensure a safe environment for these young players and their families.

Plastic Chairs: We will be renting plastic chairs for our "Little Mo" players and their families to use at the West Orange Tennis Club (host site) during the tournament. If you decide to use a chair during the day to watch your player's match, we are asking you to please return it to the stack near the front of the facility when you are finished with the match. Play "Mo" Tennis!



Welcome to the 2024 "Little Mo" Internationals in West Orange, New Jersey! When players step out on court for a match, they become responsible for what happens on their court. The following tournament rules apply:

MATCH FORMAT, SCORING, AND RULES:

- All divisions will use the same scoring formats regardless of age, ball type or draw format, but we will be using several different scoring formats based on the event type:
 - Singles: All Singles matches (Main Draw and Consolation) will consist of two tiebreak sets (first to 6 games). At 6 games all, a 7-point set tiebreak (first to 7, win by 2) will be played. If players split sets, a 10-point match tiebreak (first to 10, win by 2) will be played in lieu of a third set. Regular scoring (with ad) will be used for all Main Draw matches and a 5-minute warm-up will be given before each match. No-ad scoring will be used for all Consolation matches in addition to the 3rd/4th Place playoff. A 2-minute rest period will be given between the first and second sets, and a 3-minute rest period will be given between the second set and match tiebreak. No coaching is allowed at any time. *Shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain.
 - Doubles and Mixed Doubles: All Doubles and Mixed Doubles matches will consist of an 8-game pro set (first to 8 games). At 8 games all, a 7-point match tiebreak (first to 7, win by 2) will be played. Regular scoring (with ad) will be used for all matches and a 5-minute warm-up will be given before each match. No coaching is allowed at any time. *Shortened scoring may be used in the case of rain.
- Both players and/or teams must return to the Tournament Desk after each match to report the score.
- All players will decide service and side before starting their warm-up for the match. There will be a 5-minute warm-up for all Main Draw and Consolation matches.
- <u>The server must announce the score loudly before each point</u>. Players are also responsible for keeping the score and using scorekeepers at all times.
- The receiver must play to the reasonable pace of the server. The maximum time between points is 25 seconds.
- If a player is unsure of a call, the ball is good (benefit of the doubt goes to the opponent).
- Whether on or off the court, officials will overrule any clear mistakes they observe. Officials will also be watching for any obvious foot faults.
- A player can request a medical time out for illness or an injury. The player may choose someone (a parent or coach) to treat them. An official will supervise the treatment. The maximum treatment time for a medical time out is 3 minutes. For a medical timeout involving bleeding, up to 15 minutes is allowed.
- The "Little Mo" Point Penalty System begins with a warning, then forfeiture of a point, then forfeiture of a game, followed by an additional loss of game (or default) as determined by the Referee and Tournament Director. An immediate default can also be used in egregious situations as determined by the Referee and Tournament Director. Violations include ball abuse, racquet abuse, obscenities, yelling out, crying or being a distraction, parental interference, coaching, and anything else that could be considered unsportsmanlike behavior.
- <u>Only players (not parents) may call for an official to be on the court, but parents can be helpful in alerting</u> <u>officials of any emergencies</u>. A player must first raise their racquet high so that an official can see it and come to the court. The only reason players may leave the court is to obtain an official.
- Parents are <u>not</u> allowed to lean on the fence or interfere with the match in any way.
- No cell phones, watches or electronic devices are allowed while on court. Also, please <u>do not</u> talk on your cell phone near the tennis courts and put it on "silent" while matches are in progress.
- If a player needs to go to the bathroom, they need to get permission from an official. To minimize loss of momentum <u>during the set</u> caused by a bathroom break, the player(s) taking the break will give a courtesy point to their opponent(s). This is <u>not</u> a penalty point. A courtesy point will <u>not</u> be given for a bathroom break taken at the end of a set. <u>This rule is unique to the "Little Mo" tournaments</u>.



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A NOTE TO PLAYERS:

The sun can be intense so please make sure you are well hydrated before coming to the court. Start drinking liquids the night before (starting the morning of your match is too late). Water and ice will be available at the host site. Be sure to use sunscreen and apply it at least thirty minutes before each match.

Since officials will be calling foot faults, you may want to check your serves during practice sessions to make sure your feet are not touching the baseline until after the ball is hit. Make sure all cell phones, watches, and electronic devices are turned off and left with your parent before entering the court. In order to be considered a good sport, you must display good sportsmanship both on and off the court.

Good sportsmanship includes:

- saying "good shot" to the opponent when deserved or "nice try" when the opponent makes a great effort at trying to get the ball
- not pumping your fist at the opponent at any time, especially after a good shot
- not screaming out during the match (i.e., "let's go", "come on", "vamos") you may say these words quietly to yourself so not to disrupt nearby matches
- not hitting the ball to the back fence or into the net in anger at any time
- handing the balls nicely to the opponent or hitting the balls softly and accurately to the opponent during the match (i.e., change of server, after a point, changing sides)
- not asking "are you sure" repeatedly after each of the opponent's line calls

The officials will be roving the courts and watching for the behaviors listed above. It is very important to make proper line calls. If you are unsure of a call, the benefit of the doubt goes to the opponent. A ball that is 99% out is 100% in. When a player deliberately makes incorrect calls in order to gain an advantage, everyone in the crowd who is watching the match sees it and the opponent knows it as well. This reputation will follow you for the rest of your junior career and we **do not** want that to happen to you. Let the memory of your match be a good one for both you and your opponent, whether you win or lose. Please request an official at any time if you need anything. Also, please review the code of conduct/rules/scoring format before your first match so you understand what is expected.

A NOTE TO PARENTS / COACHES:

Watching the match can be a hard job for parents and coaches, especially if there is a problem or a questionable call. Although staying uninvolved is difficult, <u>it is necessary</u>. Once your player enters the court, it is their match. **Explain to your player that they will be on their own once they step onto the court and that you will <u>not</u> be able to talk to or coach them in any way during the match**. Emphasize and explain what good sportsmanship is to your player and why it is important. *Also, a friendly reminder that all multilingual parents and coaches must only speak or cheer in English when their player is on court. Appropriate cheering is allowed, but it must be in English so that officials are able to monitor for coaching*. Please note it is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to educate any guests who attend your player's match that they understand tennis court etiquette (specifically for larger groups) and how important it is to remain quiet during the match and not be disruptive in any way. Spectator behavior can result in penalty points to the player.

Parents and coaches are <u>not</u> allowed to talk on cell phones near the courts when matches are in progress. They are also <u>not</u> allowed to make any line calls or assist in any scoring disputes, as that is the job of the official. **Coaching is <u>not</u> permitted at any time (i.e., hand signals or anything that is instructional such as "stay on your game plan", "make him/her play", "focus"). Also, inappropriate cheering is <u>not</u> allowed (i.e., clapping when the opponent double faults or makes an unforced error, excessive or constant cheering/clapping that is disruptive, making discouraging remarks about the opponent)**. Parents and coaches are allowed to say "come on", "let's go", or "let's play" but quietly and not disruptive to other spectators and nearby matches. It is proper court etiquette to cheer for the good shots of both players. It is our hope that as parents and coaches, you will set a good example for your player during the tournament and follow the gold standard of sportsmanship, integrity, and kindness.

If something is in need of attention (i.e., a player is out of water, a player is having a health issue, a racquet needs to be returned to the player, a ball is lost over the fence), the player must get an official's attention and request their assistance. **Only players (not parents or coaches) may call for an official to be on the court, but parents and coaches can be helpful in alerting officials of any emergencies**.

The 2024 "Little Mo" Slam!

Have you ever dreamed of winning the tallest trophy in junior tennis?



Born in San Diego, Maureen became the first woman to achieve the Grand Slam of tennis in 1953 by winning all four major championships (Australian, French, Wimbledon, and US Open) in the same year. She was well known for her powerful groundstrokes from the baseline, which earned her the famous nickname "Little Mo" - a comparison to the explosive firepower of the battleship USS *Missouri*, also known as "Big Mo". Only five players in the history of tennis have won the calendar Grand Slam, and Maureen is still the only American woman and the youngest at age 18 to have accomplished this magnificent feat. She won an amazing nine consecutive championship titles (three US, three Wimbledon, two French, one Australian - <u>undefeated in 50 matches</u>).

In 2013, MCB created the ultimate challenge for any player (ages 8-12) to win the "Little Mo" Slam. The Slam was created in honor of Maureen Connolly's Grand Slam win in 1953 - winning all four major championships (Australian, French, Wimbledon, and US Open) in the same calendar year. If a "Little Mo" player can win their <u>vellow ball division</u> at all three "Little Mo" Internationals (Colorado, New Jersey, Florida) in the same year, they will receive the tallest trophy in junior tennis (6 feet tall) and the title of "Little Mo" Slam Champion! The Slam continues this year with the 1st leg at the U.S. Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado (June 28 - July 3). The 2nd leg will take place at the West Orange Tennis Club in West Orange, New Jersey (August 17-21). The 3rd and final leg will be held at

the Palm Beach Gardens Tennis Center in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida (December 6-11). There have been 11 players who have accomplished this magnificent feat in the past 11 years.

By playing in the "Little Mo" tournaments, you are one of the youngest and brightest future stars in junior tennis, and with that comes great responsibility. You are a role model for other players (especially those younger than you) so we hope you will follow in Maureen Connolly's footsteps and be a positive example for those around you. You also represent your family, coaches, friends, tennis academy, and club so we ask you to be the *best* you can be and display outstanding sportsmanship on and off the court.

Maureen Connolly was known for her many outstanding victories, but more importantly for her exemplary sportsmanship and kindness on and off the court. To honor her legacy, the "Little Mo" tournaments offer special "Mo" Coins to players who display good sportsmanship and who are respectful and kind to others. The referee, officials, and tournament staff will have the colorful "Mo" Coins in their pockets to give to players during the event. All players will be able to trade in their coins for prizes at the "Little Mo" Booth during the tournament (each coin is worth \$1). The "Little Mo" Booth will be located at the host site.

It is our hope that these "Mo" Coins will encourage good sportsmanship, friendship, and kindness during the tournament and whenever you play tennis.

To earn "Mo" Coins:

- a) Call lines fairly and keep up with the right score
- b) Hit the balls back nicely to the server
- c) Congratulate your opponent after a great point
- d) Do not show any anger, throw your racquet or scream out "come on"
- e) Shake your opponent's hand after the match
- f) Respond in a respectful manner to all officials and tournament staff
- g) Offer to help the tournament staff if they need any assistance
- h) Pick up items to help keep the tournament site clean
- i) Hold the door open for someone who is carrying a lot of items

Maureen Catherine Connolly Brinker, affectionately called "Little Mo", was born on September 17, 1934 in San Diego, California. She began playing tennis at age nine in 1943 on the public courts of the Balboa Tennis Club in San Diego.

Although her career spanned three years, many premier sportswriters consider her to be the finest of all female players. In 1953 at the age of 18, she was the first woman to win the "Grand Slam" of tennis by claiming all four major events in one calendar year (Australian, French, Wimbledon, and US Open). She lost only one set in the process. She is still the only American woman and the youngest to have accomplished this magnificent feat. To put the significance of her "Grand Slam" achievement into perspective, only five players in the history of tennis have won the "Grand Slam" of singles championships.

Nicknamed "Little Mo" for her powerful, accurate ground strokes (a comparison to "Big Mo", the battleship USS *Missouri*), Maureen was devastating from the baseline and seldom needed to go to the net. A small and compact right-hander (5-foot-4), she won her major singles championships as a teenager: three successive Wimbledon titles (1952-54), three consecutive U.S. Championships at Forest Hills (1951-53), two French Championships (1953-54), and one Australian Championships (1953).

Maureen was the #1 junior girl in the nation in 1949 and 1950, winning the 18 and under singles and doubles titles at the National Jr. Championships. In 1951, 1952 and 1953, Maureen was the undisputed world champion. She was voted "Woman Athlete of the Year" by the Associated Press for those three consecutive years.

A cheerful and sporting competitor, Maureen crushed the opposition, never losing an important match, only occasionally losing a set. She helped the U.S. beat Britain in the Wightman Cup matches of 1951-54 by winning all seven of her singles. Nobody has measured up to her perfect record in the majors. She sailed through nine successive majors (three U.S. titles, three Wimbledon titles, two French titles, one Australian titles), unbeaten in 50 matches.

In July 1954, Maureen's playing career ended with heartbreaking suddenness when she was involved in a horseback riding accident. After winning her third consecutive Wimbledon title, she was riding her beloved Tennessee Walker, Colonel Merry Boy, in San Diego with two friends on a private dirt road. A cement truck unexpectedly rounded the corner, sideswiped her horse, and severely injured her leg.

"I knew immediately I'd never play again," Maureen said later.

Although she was unable to compete any longer at her elite championship level, Maureen's love of the sport continued. She dedicated herself to the promotion of the game of tennis, conducting clinics throughout the nation and becoming one of the game's outstanding teachers. Maureen married Norman Brinker in 1955 and had two daughters, Cindy and Brenda. She was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1968. In 1969, she lost her valiant battle with cancer and passed away at the young age of 34.

This remarkable champion is memorialized through her namesake, The Maureen Connolly Brinker Tennis Foundation (MCB), which is dedicated to the promotion and support of junior tennis development worldwide. Maureen's dream of establishing a foundation was based on her desire to give back to the game she loved so much. She was raised by a single mother and due to financial constraints, she was unable to travel to national tournaments. There were a few organizations in California that helped her with travel grants to cover expenses. Maureen thought at that time if she was ever in a position where she could help some young, promising players financially to travel to tournaments in order to improve their rankings, she would do it. This was the seed that was planted over fifty years ago in forming the foundation.


